Brunswick Exploration Inc. (BRW-V)

Brunswick increases Anais strike extent to over 350 meters, Anatacau Main Project, Eeyou Istchee-James Bay.

On June 10, 2026, Brunswick announced additional results from the 2026 winter drilling campaign at the Anatacau Main Project, located in the Eeyou Istchee-James Bay region of Québec. Final assay results highlight the lateral continuity of the main Anais dyke, with step-out drilling intersecting multiple large, well-mineralized pegmatites. Step-out drill hole AN-26-12 intercepted 1.13% Li₂O over 27.4 meters suggesting the Anais Main dyke remains open in all directions. Recall on May 11, 2026, Brunswick had reported additional results with 1.10% Li₂O over 17.7 m in drill hole AN-26-08 within a larger package of continuous lithium mineralization of 123 m at 0.72% Li₂O (see: https://www.linkedin.com/posts/eric-lemieux-9468715_quebec-jamesbay-anatacau-share-7459666960549613568-fPJJa?utm_source=share&utm_medium=member_desktop&rcm=ACoAAAEcWYBYv9IQ3WrNxLu2IPkWSB479AjztI). Brunswick on April 15, 2026, had disclosed initial results from the 2026 winter drilling campaign at the Anatacau Main Project that was designed to confirm the down-dip and lateral extensions of the Anais Main dyke at depth and extend the pegmatite trend to the east (https://www.linkedin.com/posts/eric-lemieux-9468715_quebec-jamesbay-anatacau-activity-7450349426700816384-Zuyr?utm_source=share&utm_medium=member_desktop&rcm=ACoAAAEcWYBYv9IQ3WrNxLu2IPkWSB479AjztI).

Hole AN-26-12 was collared into a mineralized pegmatite and intersected up to 6 well-mineralized, stacked pegmatite dykes, including the continuous interval of lithium mineralization of 27.4 meters grading 1.13% Li₂O at a vertical depth of 90 m. This interval appears to correlate with the Anais Main dyke, located ~80m to the NE, which has now been continuously intersected over large widths by drilling over a strike length of 350 m.

Holes AN-26-11 and AN-26-13 were drilled in a wide fence pattern, to evaluate the extreme eastward extension of the mineralized system. It was interpreted that both holes were drilled outside of the deformation corridor which hosts mineralization at Anatacau. Nonetheless, the holes still intersected several highly fractioned pegmatites. While no significant lithium values were reported, assays returned elevated cesium and tantalum values which, when combined with low K/Rb ratios in the pegmatites, confirms that the pegmatite system remains fractionated even outside the structural corridor likely expanding the exploration potential surrounding the Anais Main dyke area.

Ongoing confirmation of potential continuity and size: The continuity of the Anais dykes at depth continues to be confirmed by the 2026 diamond drill campaign. Brunswick has disclosed results from 7 of the 7 drill holes completed during the 2026 winter campaign, totaling 1,800 m. Overall, we estimate an average grade x thickness metric of 23.47 Li₂O x m for 11 holes.

The area surrounding the Anais Main dyke forms an extensive mineralized system that has now been drill-traced over an area of ~350 m wide by 600 m long.

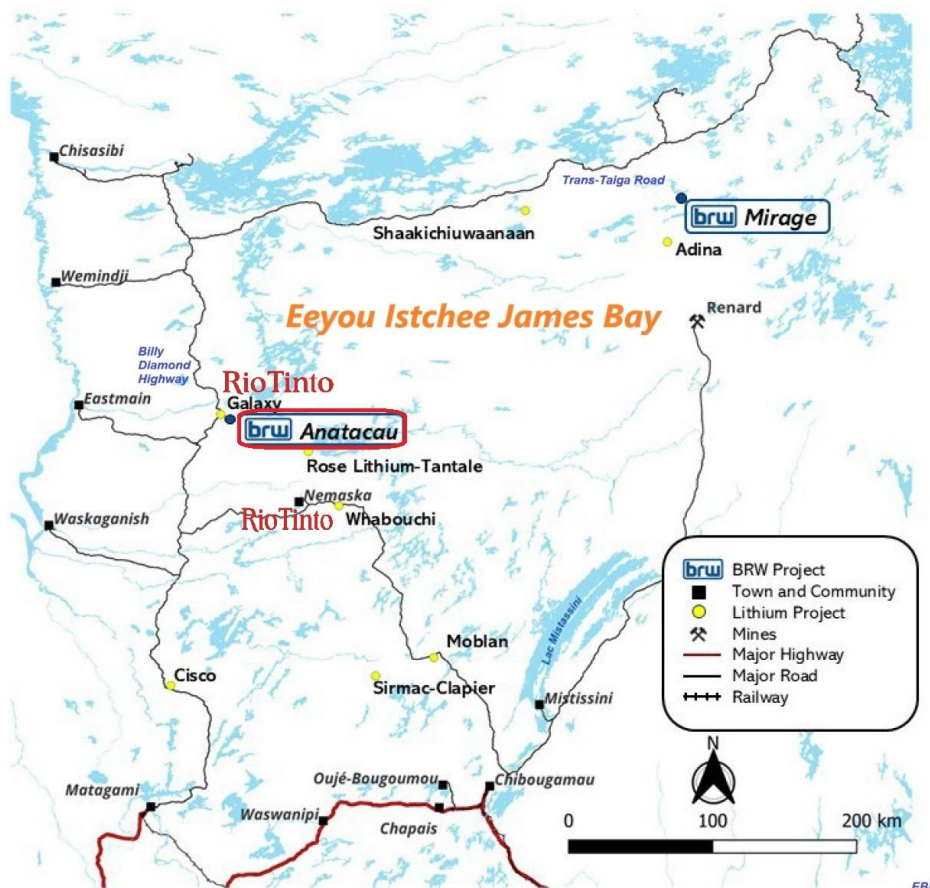
The mineralized system is mostly hosted within highly folded and sheared mafic-volcanic and metasedimentary rocks. Drilling in the area has consistently intersected high grade lithium mineralization and, in some cases, also intersected pegmatites highly enriched in cesium and tantalum, with all types of mineralization occurring over substantial widths. The Anais Main dyke is interpreted to be gently folded, oriented N-S to NE-SW, dipping at 85° to the West and hosted within the same structural corridor that hosts Rio Tinto's Galaxy Project (54.3 Mt M&I at 1.30% Li₂O and 55.9 Mt Inferred at 1.29% Li₂O) as well as BRW's Anatacau West Project, which is immediately contiguous to Rio Tinto's claim package and located ~20 km west of the Anais Main dyke.

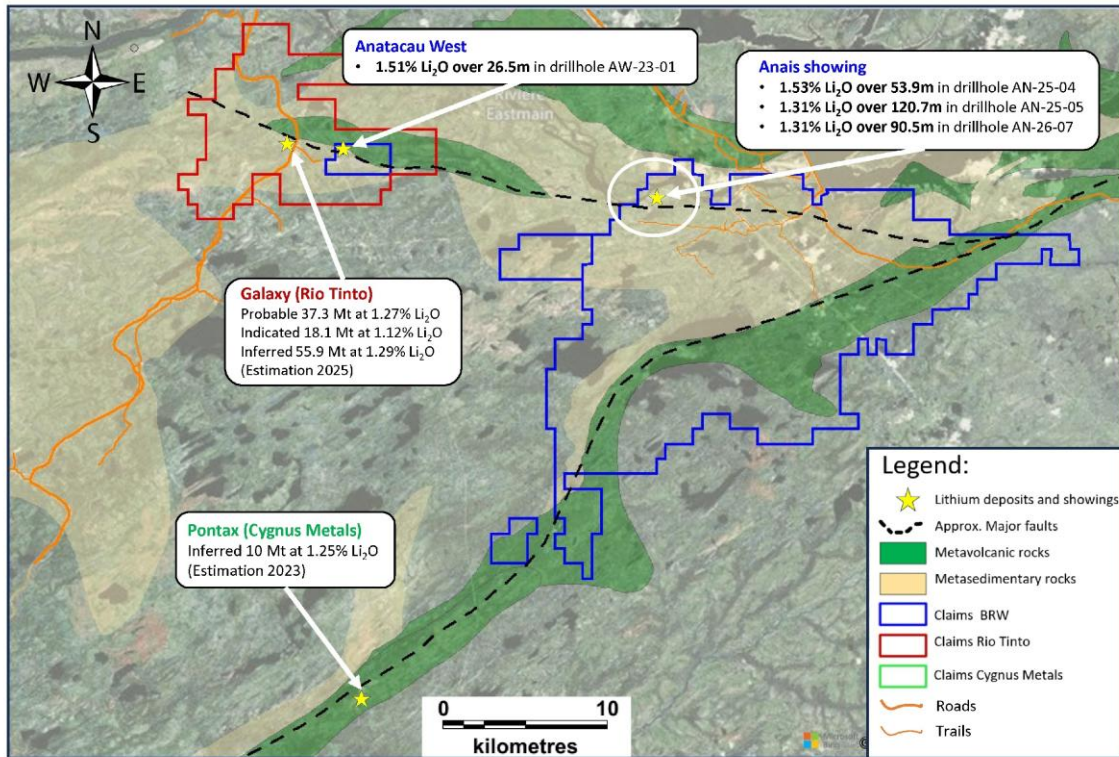
Next Steps: Brunswick has now reported all results from its 2026 winter drilling campaign, which comprised 7 drill holes. Following these encouraging drilling results, Brunswick is now planning further drilling in late Q3-2026 at Anatacau Main following a drilling campaign at Mirage (see: <https://www.linkedin.com/pulse/brunswick-exploration-inc-brw-v-announces-inferred-mineral-lemieux-ijb6e/?trackingId=rYKd61OLSfgvAWd55j6D6A%3D%3D>).

After every drilling campaign at Anatacau, we continue to grow the footprint of the pegmatite dyke system with several intervals occurring over substantial widths, highlighting the scale and exploration potential of Anatacau. We now strongly believe that Anatacau is starting to show the same potential as our Mirage project. This unique combination of two highly promising projects demonstrates BRW ability to continue to make impactful discoveries across its portfolio. We look forward to returning to Anatacau in late Q3-2026 following the completion of our forthcoming drill campaign at Mirage*".

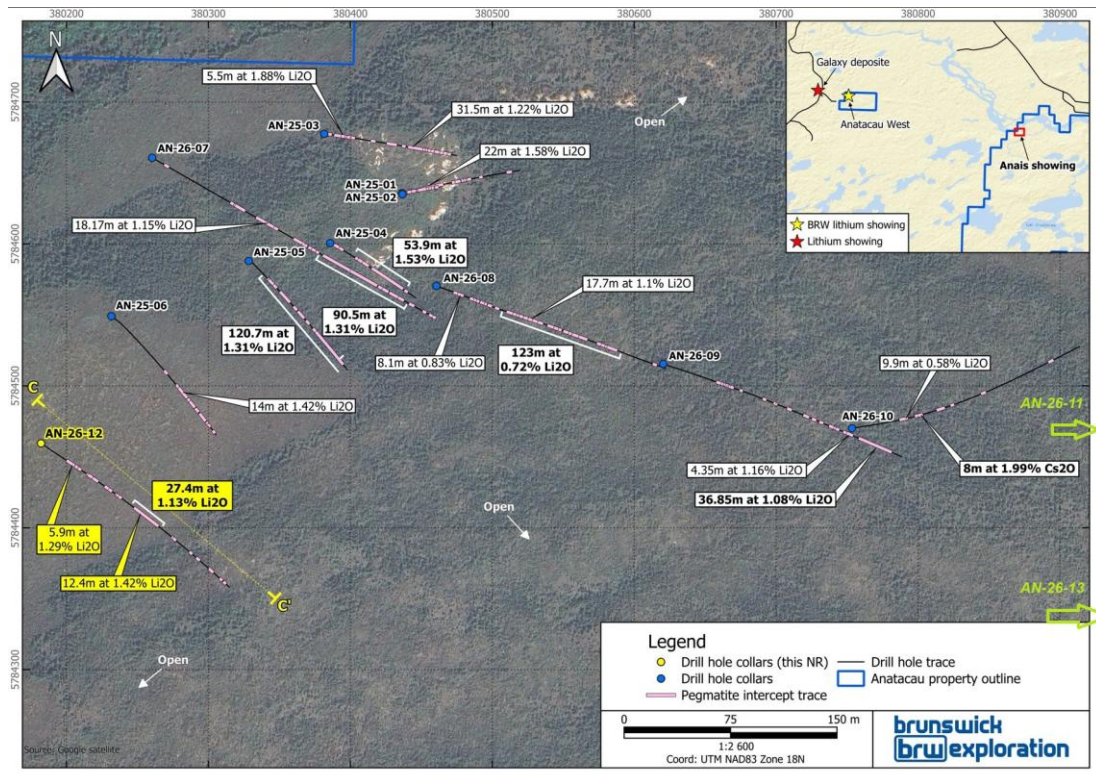

Surface Map of the Anatacau Main Project and Drill Holes Completed

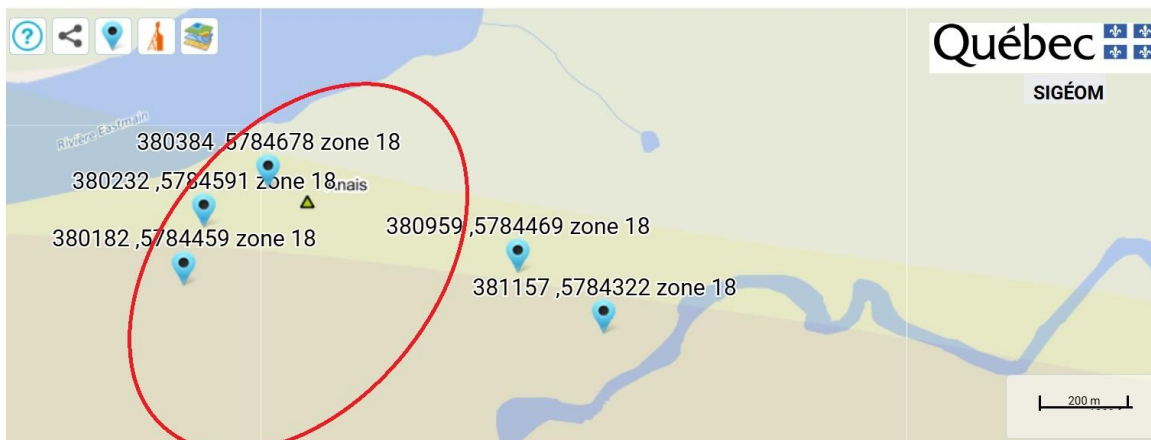
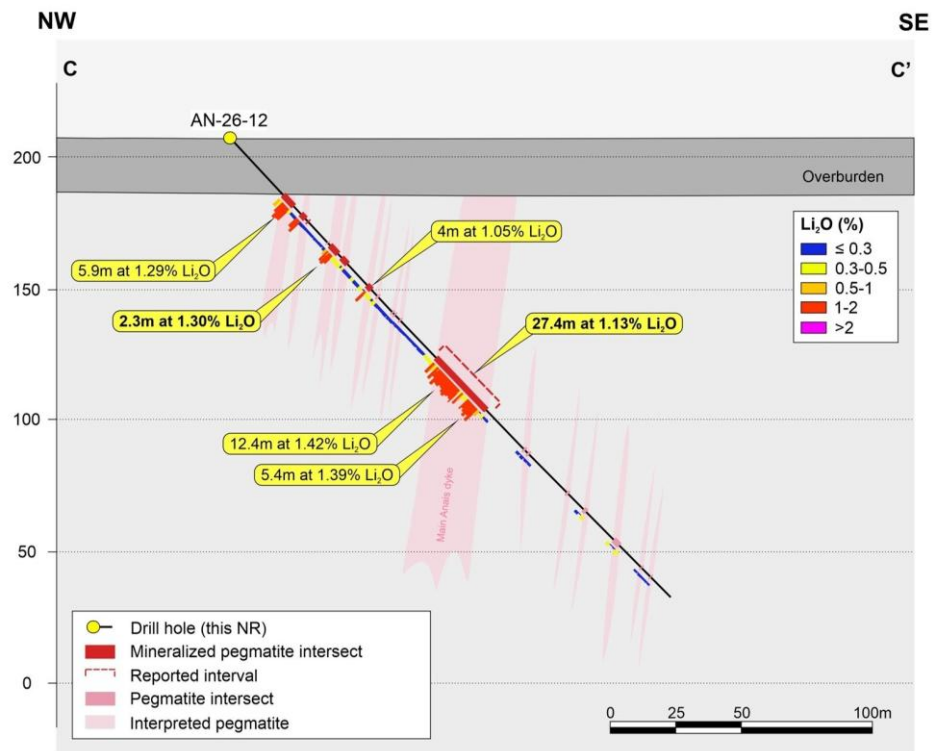

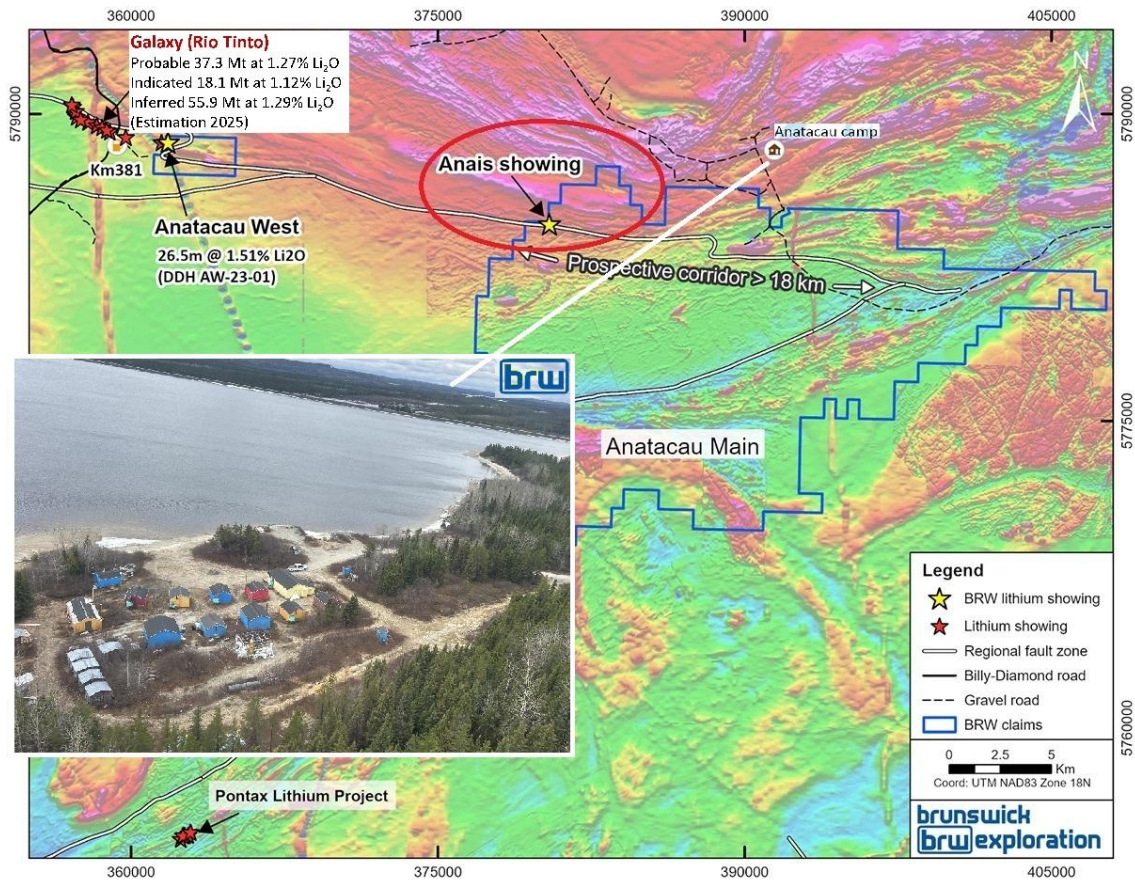

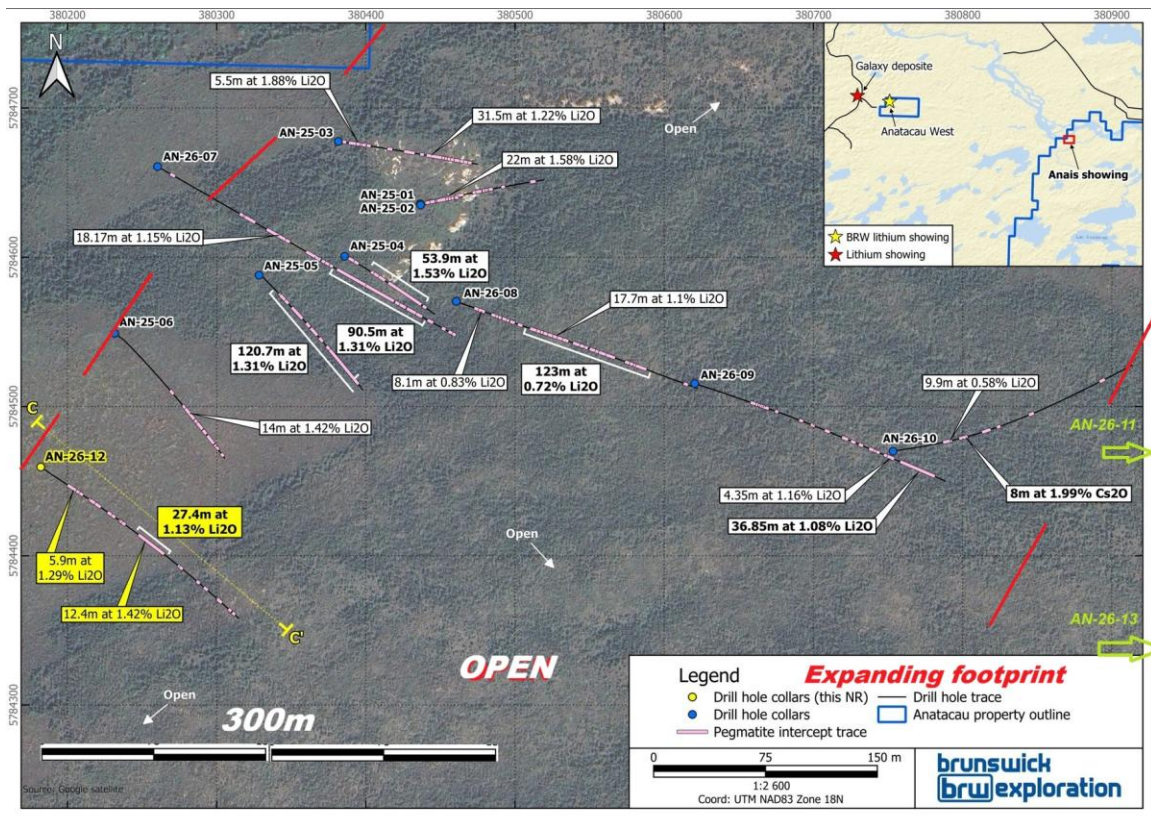
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Regional Map of the Anatacau Main and Anatacau West Projects

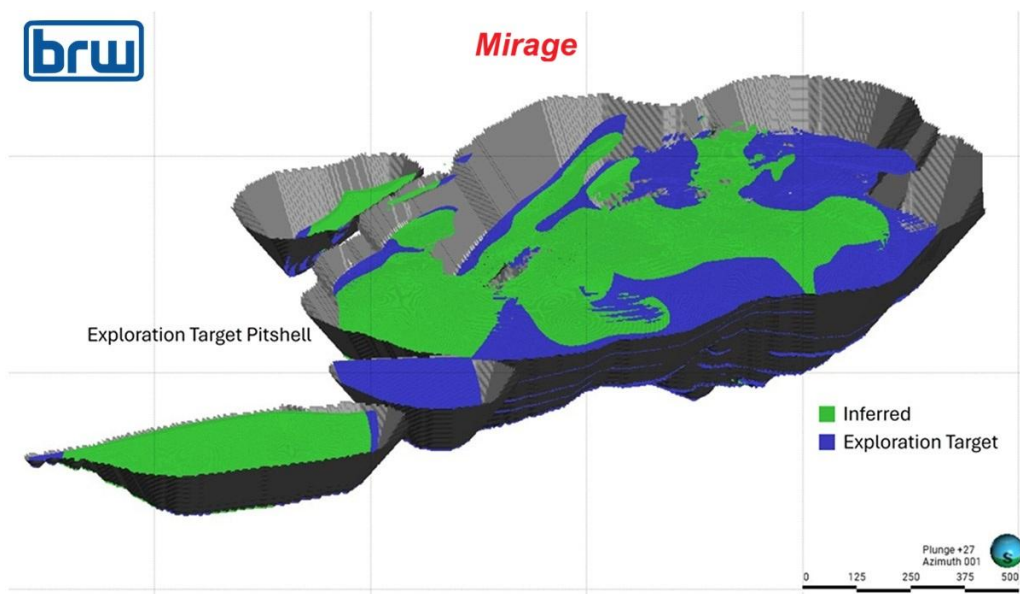
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Surface Map of the Anatacau Main Project and Drill Holes Completed
